<u>Vision and Hearing Screening - Volunteers are STILL needed - Can you help??</u>

On Thursday, November 21, 2024, we will be conducting hearing and vision screenings for our PreK, Kindergarten, 1st, 8th grade students and all new students joining SOTI this year. The screenings will be organized and supervised by the Lion's Association for Sight and Hearing of Maryland, Inc. (L.A.S.H.), who will also provide training for our volunteers.

To make this important event successful, we are seeking 15-18 VIRTUS-certified parent volunteers. 8th Grade Registration for HSPT

Registration for the High School Placement Test (HSPT) is currently open online. You may access the site via the link below, and our **deadline for registration is Tuesday, November 26, 2024**. Please, note that a \$45.00 fee is required to be paid online at the time of registration.

For students who qualify to receive accommodations, parents must upload official copies of educational test results by November 22nd. This is a firm deadline because the system will lock afterward, preventing further uploads.

SOTI students will take the exam in school on Wednesday, December 4th, and it is important that they register to test at School of the Incarnation. The high schools are listed in the first section on the registration site, and you will need to scroll through those choices to find the elementary/middle schools toward the bottom of the page.

As always, you may request to have results sent to three Archdiocese of Baltimore high schools. You may also select two Archdiocese of Washington schools for an additional \$10.00 each. (Please, note that there is no refund offered for the ADW school fees.)

CLUB HAPPENINGS:

The Dance and Cheer Squad members have been learning different dance routines and sideline cheers during their recent meetings. They were able to cheer at the girls' final home soccer game last week, which was enjoyed by the soccer team as well as families who had come to watch the game.

The Lego Explore Teams and the Robotics Challenge Team continue to engage in this year's theme, "Submerged," which has a focus on careers related to bodies of water as well as plants and animals that live within them. Team members are also learning about and practicing the program's "Core Values" of teamwork, inclusion, impact, fun, discovery, and innovation.



SOTI Asynchronous Remote Learning Days

End of Trimester Work Day

Per the updated AOB policy, there will be one day at the end of the first and second trimester designated as a teacher work day and asynchronous learning day for students. This is counted as a half-day instructional day for students and a full-day work day for all teachers and staff. There are no in person or online synchronous classes for students on this day. However, students will be provided with independent learning activities prior to the remote learning day which will be assessed and included in the next marking period. Students will be expected to complete lessons provided by teachers via Google classroom and SOTI Studies.

- Daily assignments will be posted on SOTI Studies for all grade levels by 5:00 PM the day prior to the asynchronous learning day.
- Attendance will be based on completion of assignments
- Assignments should be completed independently at home with minimal support needed.
 - PreK will have a simple activity to be completed at home
 - K-5 will have one assignment for both math and ELA with an additional assignment from religion, science, social studies, or cross-curricular. Each assignment should take approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
 - Grades 6-8 will have one assignment for each core subject: math, ELA, religion, science, and social studies. Each assignment should be approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
- Student work must be submitted to the teacher by the time they arrive at school on the next school day. Classwork and/or assessments that are due may be locked and marked as incomplete if not done in the expected window of time.

Inclement Weather Remote Learning Day

Per the AOB policy regarding inclement weather, after the first three inclement weather days of the year, the school will pivot to asynchronous learning for the next two inclement weather days. On those days, students will be expected to complete lessons provided by teachers via Google classroom and SOTI Studies.

- Daily assignments will be posted on SOTI Studies for all grade levels by 8:00 AM on asynchronous learning days.
- Attendance will be based on completion of assignments

- Assignments should be completed independently at home with minimal support needed.
 - PreK will have an optional activity to be completed at home
 - K-5 will have one assignment for both math and ELA with an additional assignment from religion, science, social studies, or cross-curricular. Each assignment should take approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
 - Grades 6-8 will have one assignment for each core subject: math, ELA, religion, science, and social studies. Each assignment should be approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
- Student work must be submitted to the teacher by the time they come to school the following day. Classwork and/or assessments that are due may be locked and marked as incomplete if not done in the expected window of time.
- Specials (art, PE, music, world cultures, Spanish) will not post assignments for weather-related school closures.
- Parents and students should communicate questions directly to the teachers.

What is Grandparents and Special Friends Day? What can we expect?

This is a special event that allows our students to share SOTI with someone important in their life. Grandparents and special friends will gather in Marian Hall to hear from Ms. Baker about the wonderful things happening at SOTI every day. Then, they will have the opportunity to join their student in the classroom for visits full of hospitality, game playing and a special snack prepared for them by their student.

What time should grandparents arrive?

Grandparents should arrive no earlier than 15 minutes before their session starts to keep the parking lot moving smoothly.

Where do grandparents enter campus?

Grandparents should enter through the lower gate, just as you would for morning drop off.

Where should grandparents park?

We hope that many grandparents and special friends can attend this wonderful event! Please keep in mind that parking is limited on campus. Teachers and staff will be parking on the field, to allow for the entire lot (including the late lot) to be open for grandparents. There will be staff members in the lot to direct traffic. We also suggest carpooling if multiple grandparents and special friends from one family are attending the event. Another low-stress option is to arrange a ride from family members to drop off at the front door, so that visitors won't need to worry about parking at all.

What should we do if our Grandparent or special friend has mobility issues and requires assistance?

Please indicate that assistance is required in the appropriate space on the Registration Form. Someone will contact you to discuss arrangements.

Where should grandparents go upon arrival?

All visitors will check in at the registration tables located outside the front entrance of the school. From there, grandparents will be directed to Marian Hall. Student ambassadors will be in the lobby and hallways to escort our guests. Classroom visits will follow.

What should I do if my grandparent has more than one grandchild in the same session?

Grandparents can divide up between their students, or the older student may attend the program in the younger sibling's classroom.

What if a grandparent has students in more than one session?

Grandparents who are staying for consecutive sessions may return to Marian Hall at the conclusion of the classroom portion of the previous session. They do not need to return to the registration table. Grandparents who have a break in between sessions may choose to leave and return for their final session or they may return to Marian Hall and enjoy a cup of coffee while they wait for their final session to begin.

Will there be refreshments served?

As an act of service and gratitude, we ask that each student pack a snack to share with their grandparent or special friend. We encourage the students to complete this with as little parental assistance as possible so that the snack is truly a gift from them to their special guest. Coffee will be available in Marian Hall.

Can the student leave with his/her grandparent or special friend?

Students who have been given parental permission on the registration form may leave with a grandparent or special friend at the conclusion of the classroom visit. Students will be signed out directly from their classroom. Please note: **ALL GUESTS WHO ARE PERMITTED TO SIGN OUT STUDENTS MUST PROVIDE A VALID PHOTO I.D.**

What if my grandparent is going to multiple sessions? How will he/she sign out my other children?

At the conclusion of their final session, the grandparent should sign out the student they are with directly from the classroom. The grandparents and that child should then report to the front desk to have the remaining siblings signed out and called from their classrooms.

What if my student does not leave with his/her grandparent or special friend?

Your child will follow the normal dismissal procedures.

Should my child come to school if they do not have any guests attending?

Yes! While Grandparents & Special Friends Day is a special event where relatives can bond and see your children in action at school, we will take special care in ensuring that all of our students—whether they have a visitor or not—feel included during the day. If you choose for your student to stay at home, please follow the normal procedure for notifying the school of an absence.





New Family Referral Program

Our current Incarnation families are by far the best ambassadors for spreading the word about our school! Our New Family Referral Program rewards current families with a one-time \$250 tuition credit for referring a new family who applies and enrolls. Here's how it works:

- If you know of a family that you believe may be interested in School of the Incarnation, complete the "New Family Referral Form" below and submit to the school office.
- Reach out to the family and share your experiences at School of the Incarnation. Share with them the reasons you have chosen Catholic education and why you think they should do the same. Let them know that you have or will refer their information to the school and that an admissions representative will call or email them to provide more information.
- For each new family that applies and enrolls at least one full-time student, a \$250 tuition credit will be awarded to the current referring family after the new student has been in attendance for 30 days.
- Siblings of current students and previously enrolled students do not qualify as new families. Staff members are not eligible for the referral credit.
- Note that this form must be on file in the front office before the new family has contacted the school on their
 own for information or to visit so it is best to submit the form as soon as possible after speaking with the new
 family. In other words, the referral form is not retroactive and you are not eligible for the referral if the family
 contacts school before the referral.
- This referral program is open to all families with students currently enrolled in PreK4-Grade 8.
- Referral fees are limited to one per family per academic year.
