### **Theater Club Spring Musical Auditions**

The spring musical will be Disney's Beauty and The Beast Jr. Middle school students looking to perform in the show will need to sign up for an audition time slot on SOTI Studies (or here) and perform a verse and a chorus from a song of their choosing (about a minute and a half). Students must be enrolled online in order to audition and receive a role. Enroll for Spring Theater HERE!

Auditions will be held after school on Monday, December 16th and Tuesday, December 17th until 5pm. If students are called back for a role, they will be asked to attend callbacks on Wednesday, December 18th until 4pm.

Crew members may sign up online and confirm that they would like to participate in the crew. The average cast member should expect to be called for rehearsal 2-3 times a week, depending on their role. A detailed rehearsal schedule will be issued to parents each month. The show dates are Friday, May 16th at 7:00 PM and Saturday, May 17th at 8:00 PM.

### Christmas Parties, Volunteers & Dismissal on Friday, December 20th

Many parent volunteers will be here for class parties throughout the morning. If you are here for a class party and would like to sign your child out after the party, you may do so. However, anyone signing their child out early must do so by 11:00 AM so as to be out of the parking lot by 11:15 and not interfere with the regular dismissal.

Regular dismissal begins with prayers at 12:02 PM. Immediately afterwards, bus and HOV students are dismissed. General dismissal begins at 12:10 PM. Access to the Gold and Maroon lots will close at approximately 12:10 PM or when the students begin to come outside.

\*\*There is no afternoon ESP on Friday, December 20th - all students must be picked up at noon.

An off campus luncheon has been planned for the faculty and staff after dismissal. Please be mindful of this and be sure to arrive on time.

### Re-Enrollment 2025-2026 School Year

Re-enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year for all *current* SOTI students has begun. The re-enrollment fee schedule for the 2025-2026 school year is:

- \$115/student if paid between December 3rd and January 10th
- \$175/student if paid between January 11th and January 31st
- \$250/student if paid between February 1st and February 14th
- If not paid by February 14th, your child's spot will be released

### **New Family Referral Program**

Our current Incarnation families are by far the best ambassadors for spreading the word about our school! Our New Family Referral Program rewards current families with a one-time \$250 tuition credit for referring a new family who applies and enrolls. Here's how it works:

- If you know of a family that you believe may be interested in School of the Incarnation, complete the "New Family Referral Form" below and submit to the school office.
- Reach out to the family and share your experiences at School of the Incarnation. Share with them the reasons you have chosen Catholic education and why you think they should do the same. Let them know that you have or will refer their information to the school and that an admissions representative will call or email them to provide more information.
- For each new family that applies and enrolls at least one full-time student, a \$250 tuition credit will be awarded to the current referring family after the new student has been in attendance for 30 days.
- Siblings of current students and previously enrolled students do not qualify as new families. Staff members are not eligible for the referral credit.
- Note that this form must be on file in the front office before the new family has contacted the school on their
  own for information or to visit so it is best to submit the form as soon as possible after speaking with the new
  family. In other words, the referral form is not retroactive and you are not eligible for the referral if the family
  contacts school before the referral.
- This referral program is open to all families with students currently enrolled in PreK4-Grade 8.
- Referral fees are limited to one per family per academic year.
